We painted fall sun catchers. Everyone had lots of fun and did a good job. Sheila loves painting and coloring and she does a great job.



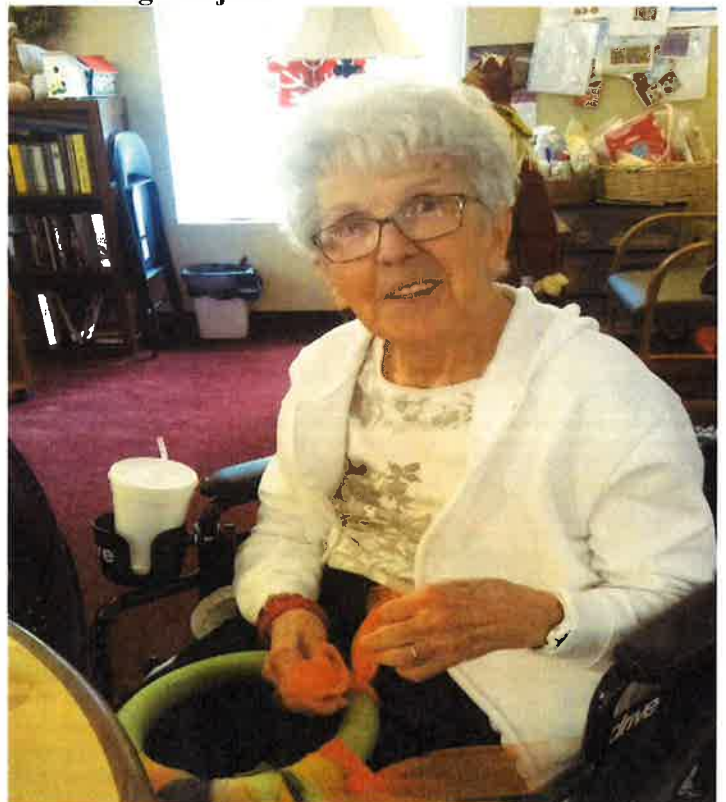
Virginia doesn't like painting much; but she had a good time and did a great job as well.
